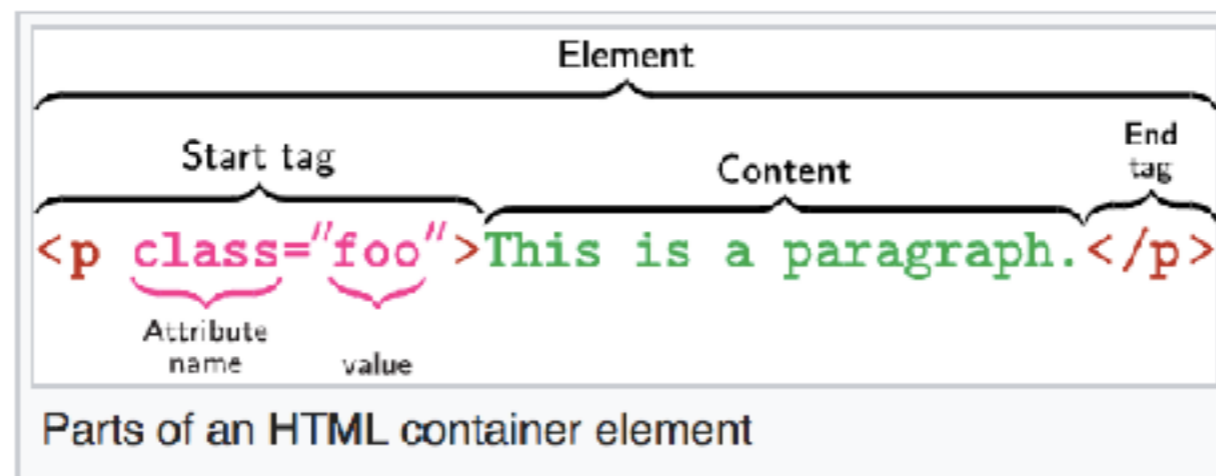
HTML

HTML

- **HTML** (HyperText Markup Language) is the most basic building block of the Web. It describes and defines the *content* of a webpage along with the basic layout of the webpage.
- HTML tags label pieces of content such as "heading", "paragraph", "table", and so on
- [Web browsers](#) receive HTML documents from a [web server](#) or from local storage and render them into multimedia web pages.

HTML Elements

- HTML elements are delineated by *tags*, written using [angle brackets](#).



- Void elements/self closing tags** only have a start tag, which contains any [HTML attributes](#). `` , `

Most common tags

<code><h1> - <h6></code>	Heading
<code><p></code>	Paragraph
<code><i></code>	Italic
<code></code>	Bold
<code><a></code>	Anchor
<code> & </code>	Unordered List & List Item
<code><blockquote></code>	Blockquote
<code><hr></code>	Horizontal Rule
<code></code>	Image
<code><div></code>	Division

Block elements : A block-level element always starts on a new line and takes up the full width available

Inline element : does not start on a new line and only takes up as much width as necessary.

Document Structure

Document structure elements [\[edit \]](#)

`<html>...</html>`

The [root element](#) of an HTML document; all other elements are contained in this. The HTML element delimits the beginning and the end of an HTML document. **Standardized** in [HTML 2.0](#); still current.

`<head>...</head>`

Container for processing information and metadata for an HTML document. **Standardized** in [HTML 2.0](#); still current. (See [document head elements](#) for child elements.)

`<body>...</body>`

Container for the displayable content of an HTML document. **Standardized** in [HTML 2.0](#); still current. (See [document body elements](#) for child elements.)
